



Evidence of Impact on Student Retention and Success


❖ The first year retention rate of the 2011-12 cohort who resided on-campus was an 88.96% compared to 85.46% of students living off-campus. Students who resided in Living Learning Communities (LLC) had a higher retention rate of 91.66%.



Students who lived on-campus during their first year, as well as students who lived on-campus during their second year, had significantly higher 4 year and 6 year graduation rates than students who lived off-campus.



❖ The Spring 2012 GPA of students living off-campus was a 3.03 compared to a 3.14 GPA for students living oncampus. Students living in LLC had a significantly higher GPA of 3.31.
